What Does It Mean to Be Born Again?

Being "born again" means that your dead spirit comes to life through Jesus. The Bible tells us in John 3:3 that Jesus said, "Jesus answered him, 'Most certainly, I tell you, unless one is born anew, he can't see God's Kingdom.'" (WEB). This isn't a physical birth—it's a spiritual resurrection. When someone accepts Jesus as their Savior, their spirit is made alive in Christ, as they receive a new heart and a new spirit (Ezekiel 36:26) It means:

- 1. Our sins are forgiven.
- 2. We become God's children.
- 3. The Holy Spirit lives in us and helps us follow God.
- 4. We now have eternal life with Jesus.
- 5. Just like Margaret, when we say "yes" to Jesus, we start a fresh, new life with Him!



Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does the Bible say our battle is against?
- 2. Have you ever felt like something was stopping you from doing the right thing?
- 3. What are three things God gives us to stand strong in battle?
- 4. How can prayer help us when we feel afraid?
- 5. Write or draw a picture of you standing strong in God's power.

Activity: Listening to God's Voice

- 1. Supplies Needed: Paper and crayons (or markers)
- 2. Draw a picture of Light Carrier talking to the woman in the store.
- 3. Ask them to draw themselves in a situation where they had to listen to God's voice instead of fear.
- 4. Discussion: How do we know when God is speaking to us? What can we do when doubt tries to stop us?

Closing Prayer:

"Dear Jesus, thank You for speaking to us and helping us recognize Your voice. Give us courage to follow You, even when the enemy tries to make us afraid. We trust You, and we want to be a light in the world. **Amen!**"

Teacher's Guide - Lesson 1: Recognizing the Battle

- **1.Lesson Objectives:** 1.1. Understand that spiritual battles exist and are unseen because they are in our mind. 1.2. Recognize that God has given them authority to stand strong. 1.3. Learn how to listen to God's voice and obey Him.
- 2. Memory Verse: 2.1. "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." Ephesians 6:12 (ESV)
- 3. Lesson Overview: 3.1. Introduction: Explain that not all battles are physical—some are spiritual. 3.2. Story Time: Read *Light Carrier's Mission* and discuss. 3.3. Discussion Questions: Engage students with guided questions. 3.4. Activity: Reinforce the lesson with hands-on learning. 3.5. Workbook Questions: Test understanding and retention. 3.6. Prayer & Reflection: Encourage personal application.
- **4. Discussion Prompts for Teachers:** 4.1. What does it mean to be in a spiritual battle? 4.2. How can we tell the difference between God's voice and doubt? 4.3. Have you ever felt nervous about obeying God? What happened? 4.4. How do we "carry God's light" in everyday situations? 4.5. Why do you think the woman in the story was so moved by Light Carrier's words?
- **5.Workbook Answer Key:** 5.1. (c) Spiritual forces of evil 5.2. (a) A nudge from the Holy Spirit 5.3. (b) By whispering doubt in her mind 5.4. (c) The woman cried because she had prayed for a sign 5.5. (Open-ended; look for answers that reflect recognizing God's voice and obeying Him.)
- **6. Teaching Tips:** 6.1. For Younger Kids (5-8): Act out the story using role-play. 6.2. For Older Kids (9-12): Have students write their own "Light Carrier" moment when they listened to God. 6.3. For Group Learning: Assign small groups to discuss different questions and present their answers.
- **7.Additional Activities:** 7.1. Creative Writing: Have students write a short journal entry about a time they obeyed God. 7.2. Art Project: Draw a scene from the story or a personal "God moment." 7.3. Memory Verse Challenge: Have students practice and recite the verse in pairs.
- **8.Closing Prayer:** 8.1. "Dear Jesus, thank You for showing us that we are part of Your plan. Help us to hear Your voice, stand strong in faith, and bring Your light to those around us. Amen!"
